The Auburn Tree Commission has a new initiative to recognize those who go the extra mile to support Auburn's tree canopy.

Auburn residents are invited to apply to become an Auburn Tree Steward, a designation that celebrates individuals who care for the trees on their property. No expertise is required! Applicants are not required to be tree professionals, foresters or arborists. You only need to demonstrate your commitment and care for the trees on your property.

As part of the evaluation process, applicants will host Tree Commission members for a brief visit to showcase the applicants' support for and preservation of trees on their property.

The 2026 Class will meet monthly beginning in March and ending in September. Those who apply should be able to commit to attending the majority, if not all, of the sessions.

The program is open to all Auburn residents who are at least 19 years old. Space is limited, and all applicants will be notified of the status of their applications by March.

Get a free tree this Arbor Day

Celebrate Arbor Day by contributing to Auburn's tree canopy! The Auburn Tree Commission and Auburn Public Works will hold the annual Arbor Day Celebration on Saturday, Feb. 28.

Species available will be American Hazelnut (*Corylus americana*) and Eastern White Pine (*Pinus strobus*) — free while supplies last! Planting instructions will be included with each seedling.

Renew your Auburn business license by Feb. 17

Any business providing services or selling goods within Auburn city limits is required to have a City of Auburn business license, including home-based businesses and short-term rentals. City business licenses must be renewed by Feb. 17, 2026, to avoid late fees.

You can renew your business licenses by visiting selfservice.auburnalabama.org.

If this is the first time you are using our Citizen Self Service portal, you must first register your account and contact the Revenue Office to link your business license account to your registered username (instructions are available online). If you cannot renew online, contact the Revenue Office at revenue@auburnal.gov or (334) 501-7239 for further assistance.
