Cain named new Auburn Fire **Chief** as Lankford retires

Auburn Fire Chief Lankford retires after 30 years of service

When Auburn Fire Chief John Lankford graduated from Auburn University with a bachelor's degree in

agricultural business and economics, he weighed his options.

He briefly thought about a career in the private sector. But with two years as a student firefighter under his belt, it wasn't much of a question. His heart was set on the fire service.

With a 30-year career to look back on, Lankford retired at the end of March and passed the title of fire chief to longtime Auburn firefighter Matt Cain.

Lankford's interest in firefighting was piqued as a high school student when shadowing career opportunities in California, Originally from Birmingham, Lankford knew he wanted to move back to the South and chose to attend Auburn University — his parents' alma mater.

His first foray into the fire service was volunteering at Southwest Lee County Fire Department. He learned about Auburn Fire's student program through friends and enrolled as a student firefighter during his junior year. He soon realized he "was more into being a firefighter than going to school."

"The more I worked, the more I fell in love with the job," Lankford said. "It became a passion."

Cain appointed next **Auburn Fire Chief**

Matt Cain became the next chief of the Auburn Fire Department on April 1, stepping into the role after the retirement of Fire Chief John Lankford.

Cain began his career with

Auburn Fire as a student firefighter in 2006. Over the last 19 years, he climbed to the rank of battalion chief holding nearly every position in the department along the way.

"Chief Cain has a proven track record of leadership, dedication and commitment to the City of Auburn, the Auburn Fire Department and Auburn residents," said Auburn City Manager Megan McGowen Crouch. "I have no doubt that he will lead the Fire Department to new heights."

Cain most recently served as the City's first EMS officer, leading the department's efforts to equip personnel and emergency vehicles to better serve the community's medical rescue needs.

Since the department received its Advanced Life Support (ALS) license in October 2023, Cain helped grow the City's ALS response by equipping fire trucks with more licensed paramedics, upgrading medical equipment and implementing new procedures.

Cain holds a bachelor's degree in science from Auburn University and has been an on-shift training officer for the Fire Department since 2014. He is a Certified

Lankford was promoted to lieutenant in 1999 and became the department's training officer in 2008. He was promoted to deputy chief in 2014 and served under former Fire Chief Lee Lamar until his passing in 2015. Lankford was promoted to chief and spent the last 10 years at the helm of the department.

As chief, Lankford elevated the department's services with a focus on training, professionalism and equipment and apparatus improvements. During his tenure, he oversaw the opening of a new fire station, a new training center and the department's transition to an Advanced Life Support certified entity.



To the Auburn community who put their trust and support in the department under his leadership, Lankford said thank you.

"I appreciate the community's unwavering support over the years," Lankford said. "And I want them to know that we have a great group of men and women that are here and ready to continue providing top-tier service whenever they're needed."

(Cain continued) Advanced EMT and has extensive technical rescue and leadership training.

Alongside his duties with the Auburn Fire Department, Cain has volunteered with Southwest Lee County Fire Department since 2006. He has served as Southwest's board treasurer for 10 years, managing the department's annual budget, purchasing decisions and accounting.

Looking ahead, Cain hopes to carry forward the vision that has been cast and carried out by those who came before him. Part of that will be continuing to foster a culture that looks at every opportunity as a chance to make a difference.

Looking back on his career, Cain said one of his proudest accomplishments is the relationships he's built — not only within the department but with the Auburn community. He looks forward to expanding that as he takes on the title of chief.

"The role of fire chief is bigger than a single person," Cain said. "Much like an ambassador, it's a symbol of an entire cause. Its job is to advocate for what it represents. The Fire Department, but more importantly, the citizens it's sworn to protect. I'm honored to serve in this distinguished and influential role in our city, and I look forward to our future."

Alongside the opening of the new facility, Parks and Recreation is introducing a new membership structure with plans for every lifestyle — from those looking for a fitness upgrade to families seeking fun and wellness.

Options for Auburn residents (live or work in Auburn)

- Free Amenities Membership: Includes access to free-play basketball at Boykin Community Center (BCC), Dean Road Recreation Center (DRRC), Frank Brown Recreation Center (FBRC) and Lake Wilmore Park Recreation Center (LWP), as well as the eSports room, game room and racquetball court at FBRC.
 - Annual registration is required for this free membership.
- Paid Memberships: Includes access to all fitness centers (BCC, FBRC and LWP), indoor walking track (LWP), aquatic facilities (LWP and Samford Pool), free-play basketball (BCC, DRRC, FBRC, LW) and additional amenities at Frank Brown Recreation Center (eSports room, game room and racquetball court).
 - Individual Memberships: \$20/month or \$200/year
 - ♦ Family Memberships (up to six household members): \$60/month or \$600/year, Add-On Member: \$10/ month per additional person
 - ♦ Low-Income Discount (Medicaid Card Holders): 50% off membership fees
 - ♦ Senior Membership (65+): Membership is FREE for individuals eligible through a qualifying Medicare Advantage or supplement plan.  - Fitness Membership to BCC and FBRC ONLY: \$30/person/year

Options for non-residents & non-members

- Daily Pass: \$10 per day grants access to all fitness centers, indoor track and pools
- Pool Daily Pass: \$5 per day grants access to both pools (LWP and SP)

Current memberships at Bovkin Community Center and Frank Brown Recreation Center will be honored for those facilities ONLY. However, members interested in accessing Lake Wilmore Park Recreation Center or the pools (LWP and SP) will need to purchase a new membership and will receive a one-time \$30 discount off their first annual membership
