Improvements coming to College Street, Samford Avenue intersection

In May, we began work to improve the intersections of College Street/Samford Avenue, Samford Avenue/Gay Street and College Street/Miller Avenue. This long-awaited project will help improve traffic flow and drainage in the area while upgrading the aesthetics of the intersections, which serve as one of the primary entryways into downtown Auburn.


The project will include widening College Street to include two southbound lanes at the intersection of Samford Avenue along with widening at other intersections to add turn lanes. It will also include improved sidewalks connecting pedestrians to the Donald E. Davis Arboretum, decorative pedestrian lighting and decorative crosswalks at the College/Miller and College/Samford intersections.

New traffic signals will be installed at College/Samford, College/Miller and Samford/Gay, which will include dedicated left-turn arrows. Landscaped medians and a mid-block pedestrian crossing will be constructed between Samford and Miller avenues, and drainage improvements will be made throughout the area.

While there will certainly be some growing pains during this project, we look forward to providing our residents and Auburn's visitors with much-needed improvements to traffic flow in this area. We thank you in advance for your patience during this project, which is expected to wrap up by summer 2023.

New facility in the works for Environmental Services, Public Works

Construction will soon begin on a new facility for our Environmental Services and Public Works departments on Wire Road near the intersection of Beehive Road. The new complex will provide much-needed and sustainable space for both departments, which have outgrown their current facilities. The site will house office and warehouse space to support administrative activities and supplies storage, pole barns for equipment storage, a fleet maintenance facility, a fueling station and bulk storage space for regularly-used materials.

The new complex is designed to facilitate efficiency within both departments. For example, the project will greatly expand the space available for our Facilities Maintenance team in the Environmental Services Department. Our mechanics currently service the City's entire fleet of more than 600 units out of a six-bay facility. The new facility will have 17 bays, giving mechanics the ability to work on more vehicles at a time and return equipment back to service quicker.

Completing this project will set in motion repurposing the existing site to create a new Boykin-Donahue Campus in Northwest Auburn, which was identified in the Parks, Recreation and Cultural Master Plan. By relocating Environmental Services and Public Works, there will be space to expand the Boykin campus with new recreational and cultural amenities. The current Recycling Drop-Off Center will also be relocated across the street from its current location on North Donahue Drive to the current site of Fleet Services.

Work on the new Environmental Services and Public Works Complex is expected to last about a year, and the Boykin-Donahue Campus Improvements project will begin after those departments have relocated.

Are you taking advantage of the warmer weather to declutter and clean your home? Not sure what to do with all that stuff? Here are a few environmentally friendly tips from our Environmental Services team.

REDUCE. It is easier to de-clutter when there is less stuff in your home. Only buy what is needed. Reducing the urge to buy impulse items saves money and minimizes clutter.

REUSE. Many broken items can be repaired. Online videos and community forums can assist with a variety of repairs. Repairing items can lead to new skills and substantial savings.

SELL OR DONATE. Reusable items no longer needed by your family may be needed by another. Donate to a local thrift store or post your items online. Remember to use safety precautions when selling items online.

RECYCLE. Magazines, paper, bottles, cans and other recyclable items can be placed in your recycle bin to be processed back into use.

REMOVE HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE. Electronic waste batteries, motor oil and other household hazardous waste (HHW) require special handling. The City holds two HHW collection events each year - one in the fall and one in the spring.
