Auburn industries will soon have a new space to train and develop their employees' skills at the new Auburn Center for Developing Industries (ACDI) Business Center.

In March, Congress approved the Consolidated Appropriations Act which included a \$3 million federal appropriation to fund an expansion of ACDI. Congressman Mike Rogers requested the funding on behalf of East Alabama communities.

"It is critical that Alabama businesses have all the tools they need to thrive," Rogers said. "I am honored to continue my fight to create more job opportunities across Alabama's Third Congressional District."

ACDI currently provides startups with incubator space and houses the Advanced Manufacturing Training Center, which helps develop the skills of

Auburn's existing industries. In the same facility, the City collaborates with Auburn University's Interdisciplinary Center for Advanced Manufacturing Systems (ICAMS). This funding will help expand the center's training capabilities by adding classroom training and conference room space called the ACDI Business Center.

"This new addition will help strengthen and equip Auburn's workforce, allowing Auburn to better compete in the global market," Auburn City Manager Megan McGowen Crouch said. "This greatly needed expansion will give us another tool to prepare our industries for technological changes and will help us recruit value-added, technology-based industries to our community going forward."

The new space will be a comprehensive center for business innovation and training in areas greatly needed by our pioneering startups and industry partners. The new facility will create space for collaboration and training between technology providers, industries and academia.

Some of the focus areas will include multi-axis machining, industrial automation, digitalization of manufacturing processes, metrology as well as tool and die. The center will also serve as an education tool to teach students about advanced manufacturing and provide pre-graduation job training.

"I know I can speak for our Economic Development staff in thanking Congressman Rogers for championing this cause and for everything he does for Auburn and East Alabama," Auburn Mayor Ron Anders said.

ACDI has long served the Auburn community as a space to help fledgling companies grow and provide support for Auburn industries. The center is a partnership between the City of Auburn and its Industrial Development Board. It provides space and programming to collaborate with Auburn University, the Alabama Technology Network, Alabama Industrial Development Training and Southern Union State Community College.

Auburn Fire brushes up on wilderness rescue

For first responders, there are so many resources available to use in wilderness aid and search and rescue situations. Our Auburn Fire Department participated in a multi-agency Wilderness Class at Chewacla State Park in March to hone their skills and prepare for future emergencies.

Firefighters learned how to evaluate lost person behaviors, apply appropriate search patterns and other keys to operating in a search and rescue environment.

The Alabama Law Enforcement Agency conducted training during the class using a helicopter to rescue students deep in the woods of the park. Several agencies, including Alabama Wildlife & Freshwater Fisheries Division, used search dogs with disruption and scent tracking skills to find lost or stranded victims.



Construction regulation reminders

Last year, 741 single-family homes were permitted in Auburn, with 568 other construction permits issued. As Auburn continues to grow, we want to remind everyone of guidelines contractors must follow when working in

WORK TIMES

In single-family neighborhoods, no construction work is allowed to begin before 7 a.m., and workers must cease daily operations by 7 p.m. This is the same for commercial or multi-family sites that are adjacent to a single-family neighborhood. Construction projects in commercial or multi-family areas that are not adjacent to subdivisions are allowed to begin work at 6 a.m.

Work, such as painting or cleaning, that does not involve noise or disturb the peace may be performed at any time.

When projects involve concrete pouring in high-traffic areas, the City of Auburn allows early morning concrete pours. Earlier start times allow work to finish before peak traffic hours begin for the day. This helps avoid traffic congestion issues caused by multiple concrete trucks in one area.

ON-SITE BURNING

Residents may also notice on-site burning at active construction sites. The City requires all burning to be supervised, and contractors are required to receive a burn permit prior to any burning. City code restricts the number of days a burn permit is issued, the materials that can be burned and where burning can be located on the site. The City considers weather conditions and will issue a no-burn order if necessary based on yearly rainfall, wind conditions, humidity and other factors

If you are concerned about construction start times, on-site burning or other issues happening near you, please report the issue through the Auburn FixIt app (auburnalabama.org/fixit), and our staff will reach out to resolve the issue.
