As we approach the dawn of a new year, I am excited to share with you the release of our 2024 Parks and Recreation Events Calendar.

In 2023, we saw incredible participation and enthusiasm from our community in various events and programs. From walks in our picturesque parks to family-friendly festivals that brought us all together, these moments created lasting memories and fostered a sense of unity within our community.

One of the biggest highlights this year is the completion of the new indoor soccer facility and field expansion at the City of Auburn Wire Road Soccer complex in the fall of 2023. This indoor facility has a 160 by 350-foot indoor soccer and multipurpose court. The construction project included adding three new artificial turf fields and one natural sod practice field.

We are excited about the completion of new facilities, additions, and renovations in 2024. The Jan Dempsey Community Art Center is undergoing a renovation and expansion. Jan Dempsey is set to open in January of 2024. Work on the Lake Wilmore Recreation Center continues, and the new center is slated to open in the summer of 2024. This center will have two gyms, indoor walking track, fitness center and a covered zero entry heated pool and lap pool. There will also be the addition of twelve covered pickleball courts at Lake Wilmore.

We encourage you to take a moment to review the full calendar, available on our website auburnalabama. org/parks, and mark your calendars with the events that resonate with you. We are confident that the 2024 Events Calendar will contribute to the continued growth of our community spirit and the well-being of our residents.




