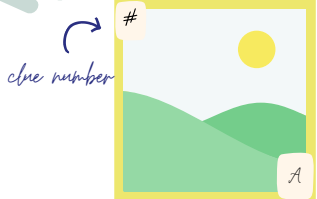
All participants must register at www.auburnalabama.org/parks/register by August 31st to be entered into the prize drawing. *Only those who have the secret phrase will be able to register.*

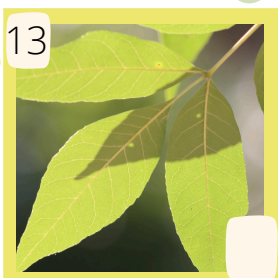
